1. Welcome from the Chair
2. Apologies from Jane Leggett, Des Cass, Mary and Peter Holtby, Martin Adeney, Peter Walton
3. Minutes of AGM of 6 June 2019 were approved. No matters arising
4. Short presentations from guest speakers on local community action and volunteering:
 - **Simon Olley, Parkland Walk Wildlife Trail** described how a group of volunteers created this special quiet place, next to the Parkland Walk from an unprepossessing wilderness. Opened in September 2019, it now provides a range of habitats for wildlife and a much increased range of flora and fauna.
 - **Richard Webber, Highgate Volunteering Project:** emphasised the importance of volunteering both for the well being of individuals and the organisations who rely on them. The project will provide a leaflet - to go to everyone in N6 - which will list all the organisations who need volunteers.
 - **Maria Kramer, BMX track and nature trail CIL project:** described how the project on land next to the Library in Shepherds Hill will provide a much needed facility for teenagers, as well as nature trail of people of all ages.
 - **Naomi Russell, Food Bank Aid, North London:** thanked everyone in Highgate for their generosity in supporting 18 food banks across North London. £1.5 million worth of food had been distributed, feeding 8,500 people a week. The food banks expect the need to increase as furlough ends, at the same time as an increased need for volunteers as many go back to work. Now a registered charity, Food Bank Aid needs drivers and people to leaflet.
