- 3. Keynote talk from Adrian Berry (joint CEO and Artistic Director, Jacksons Lane) and David Porter (Chair, Jacksons Lane Board of Trustees) they narrated the struggle of dealing with the rebuilding programme during the Covid Pandemic. They fell short of the matchfunding they needed to find for Arts Council Grant and had to revise plans by £1 million. They took the risk of closing the building to fast track the building work. Jacksons Lane has an extraordinary story: from a derelict building 45 years ago (spotted by Nicky Gavron) to a local, national and international Centre for Circus Arts.
